La Jicarita has partnered with the Mora Valley Spinning Mill in a continuing effort to support the community. The Mill is a nonprofit organization that strives to create opportunity in their community. The organization employs thirteen community members, provides a space for local artisans to display and sell their wares, and provides both a teaching and learning opportunity in the skills of weaving. The wool processed and used in the Mill is



acquired from local suppliers which helps sustain rural lifestyles in the area.

The Mill, like La Jicarita, continues to seek ways to improve our community and actively seeks opportunities to do so. Although the way the organizations express their support may differ, La Jicarita and the Mora County Spinning Mill are "community-oriented companies working together for a common goal" says Karen Vigil, Gallery Manager at the Mill.

The goals and ideals of the cooperative are aligned with JD's efforts to give back and serve the community, which is probably why JD has continued his term on the board for more than 30 of the cooperative's close to 50-year existence.

La Jicarita Fiber Project FAQs

Our Fiber to the Home project is well underway, and we'd like to share some commonly-asked questions with you:

Q: When is the fiber project going to be completed?

A: Our construction plan includes the following: Wagon Mound rural, Chacon, Ocate and the Mora, Holman, Cleveland, and Rainsville areas are on track to be complete by mid-summer.

Q: Will I get the same service even though I'm not getting Fiber?

A:Yes! Whether you have Fiber-to-the-Home or are not a part of the upgraded system, the same Internet and telephone services will be available to you. These services will simply be faster, more reliable, and better for the community.

Q: My neighbor has fiber and the crews have moved on. When will I get access to a fiber connection?

A: We are upgrading our main infrastructure to replace outdated and old wiring, hardware and other systems. Why is this such good news? You will benefit from the fiber network upgrade by receiving faster Internet with your existing connection! Due to the fiber upgrade in the main network, everyone will have access to far superior Internet access—whether through a direct Fiber-to-the-Home connection, or through DSL.

Q: Is Fiber going to cost me more?

A: Although there are many benefits to the Fiber upgrade project, including the quality of service, speed of Internet available, and the reliability of the technology, La Jicarita is offering this at no additional cost to our customers.
