Planting a garden, clearing land, or other home improvement projects that involve digging carry the



Facing the Challenges from Fires

The Road to Restoration

Recently, wildfires devastated our region, burning nearly 341,000 acres from San Miguel County to Mora County. Our hearts go out to everyone impacted by the fires, and this disaster made it clearer than ever the importance of connection and community—not only during a crisis, but to help our friends and neighbors recover from the unimaginable and the continuous aftermath.

During the Hermits Peak/Calf Canyon fire, La Jicarita and staff utilized dozer heavy equipment to fight the fire in the local surrounding areas, and management did everything in their power to maintain service for its customers, knowing that so many needed to get in touch with loved ones, especially for those who chose to stay behind from the mandatory evacuation orders. The primary reason for not having telephone and internet services was due in part of the power outages in many of the communities in the Mora Exchange. The La Jicarita staff attempted to maintain most of its remote sites with generators when possible.

"We feel we have to stay here to keep this service going for our community," said La Jicarita CEO, Danny Gray.

Still, there were times where we were unable to gain access to our plant and remote sites out of an abundance of concern from local safety enforcement, who worried about the safety of our team and believed telephone and internet were not essential during a natural disaster.

Fortunately, the La Jicarita office building was not damaged from the fires, and

we were able to remain open and provide a Wi-Fi connection to the first responders and fire personnel. Many people from the community visited the co-op's parking lot for temporary internet access to let loved ones know they reached safety.

In the aftermath, La Jicarita strived to restore all service across the county while prioritizing the safety of staff,

technicians, and the community—but the flooding following the wildfires created additional delays and complications.

Staff are in the process of issuing a credit memo on their billing for all of those impacted by this disaster and have installed a portable tower to replace the one that was destroyed.

"We're in here; we're doing our best; we have a small crew trying to keep communications going the best we can," says Gray.

The La Jicarita team is here to support our friends and neighbors throughout the region as we all work to find our way back to normalcy.

"At La Jicarita, customer satisfaction is something we take very seriously, and we understand that each member depends on us for the consistency of services," said La Jicarita Operations Manager, Michael J. Leyba.
